

SCALE OF CHARGES TO BE LEVIED BY THE LRIT COORDINATOR FOR THE LRIT-RELATED WORK IN 2022

- 1 The International Maritime Organization (IMO) appointed the International Mobile Satellite Organization (IMSO) as the LRIT Coordinator, following the entry into force of SOLAS Regulation V/19-1, and adopted Resolution MSC 275(85) in this regard.
- 2 In addition, IMO has adopted resolution MSC.263(84) on *Revised Performance Standards and Functional Requirements for the Long-Range Identification and Tracking of Ships (LRIT)*, as amended, which, *inter alia*, states:

“The LRIT Coordinator should establish and communicate to the Committee the charges it would be levying in order to recover the expenditure it incurs for providing the services specified in paragraphs 14.2 to 14.5.”
(MSC.263(84) paragraph 14.7)
- 3 Paragraph 14.7.1 of resolution MSC.263(84) contains further information about the specific services provided by the LRIT Coordinator and the entities that are liable to pay the related charges for those services.
- 4 The IMSO Assembly, at its twenty-six session in December 2020, decided to continue to use the LRIT Charging Formula, which had been initially approved by the IMSO Assembly at its twenty-third session, to establish the LRIT audit fees for LRIT Data Centres and the International LRIT Data Exchange for the years 2021 and 2022. Detailed information on the LRIT charging formula can be found in IMSO Circular LRIT/003/2015 at www.imso.org. Furthermore, the IMSO Assembly, at its twenty-seven session in September 2021, allowed the Director General to use some of the LRIT surplus to maintain the LRIT Audit fee as low as possible annually.
- 5 The Director General, using the LRIT Charging Formula, has established the indicative fees for the audit and review of LRIT Data Centres and the International LRIT Data Exchange during the period from **1 January to 31 December 2022** as set out in the annex.
- 6 All LRIT DCs will be provided with an invoice at the beginning of 2022 on the basis of their audit data from the previous year, where available. The actual audit fee payable by the auditee will be confirmed after submission of the audit sample data to IMSO.

7 The annex also lists the fees approved by the IMSO Assembly, at its twenty-six session, for other LRIT-related work IMSO may be requested to undertake within the same period.

8 A new version of this circular will be published on an annual basis by IMSO for each calendar year.
